2016-17 BUDGET ADOPTION	Mrs. DeLauter moved that the Board of Education authorize the North Bellmore School District to expend the sum in the General Fund Appropriation in the total amount of \$53,742,934 for the 2016/2017 school year. Mr. Ferrara seconded and the motion was carried 4-0.
SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT	Mrs. Testa reported that the administration of the NYS ELA tests went well this week and thanked the administrative team and the teachers for carrying out our new protocols. Our final percentage for rate of refusal for the ELA exam is 68 percent.
	Mrs. Testa announced that she was inducted into the Lions Club and will be partnering with the Club to participate in community service projects. She will also be speaking with other superintendents to encourage them to partner with their Lions clubs.
	Mrs. Testa congratulated the students who participated in the First Annual Festival Band and Chorus. It was a very successful and a wonderful opportunity for more children to perform at a higher level.
	The next budget meeting will be held at the PTA Coordinating Council meeting on April 19. The Board will also be meeting that night to vote on the Nassau BOCES budget and election of board members. A music performance and art show will take place at our annual budget vote on May 17.
STAFF DEVELOPMENT REPORT	Mr. Ferrara moved that the Board of Education approve the Staff Development Report dated April 7, 2016. Mrs. DeLauter seconded and the motion was carried 4-0.
BUSINESS DEPARTMENT UPDATE	<ul> <li>Mr. Schissler gave the following update:</li> <li><i>Enrollment</i>: Enrollment is down two students this month.</li> <li><i>Facilities</i>: High winds caused multiple alarm problems and tree damage. The maintenance crew was able to clean up some trees that were down.</li> <li><i>Budget</i>: The budget was adopted by the Board this evening. This year there will be three propositions on the ballot to vote on. No. 1 - North Bellmore budget, No. 2 - CHSD budget and No. 3 - CHSD Capital Reserve Fund. The State has adopted its budget and the district will receive additional state aid. The GEA has been restored to the district. We will still use some reserves, but \$500,000 less than we would have used. The high tax aid is frozen from previous amount, which is the same as five years ago. Mrs. DeLauter asked if the district will receive additional state aid for Pre K. Mr. Schissler stated that we have received the same amount for Pre K for the last five years. The State is talking about adding additional grant money, but not specific how it will work.</li> </ul>
CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION	Mrs. Pollitt announced that Staff Development Day was very successful. We will be continuing our literacy professional development with full day release sessions for all teachers focused on Writing Workshop. We will continue the

CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION	work Mrs. McNamara presented to the administrative team about Units of Study that will be provided to teachers. Materials will be provided to the teachers at the May professional development so they will be ready for a September launch.
	ELA testing is taking place this week and math will take place next week. Mrs. Pollitt thanked the principals for organizing the proctoring and all refusals, plus packaging the tests. NYSESLAT will take place next week. Mrs. Pollitt reported that she met with the ENL Department to review changes to the testing and share administration and scoring protocols. OLSAT was administered at the end of March to grade 2 and 3 students. District-wide scoring was held at the Teacher Center this year.
HUMAN RESOURCES/ SPECIAL EDUCATION	Ms. Eskew thanked Mr. Fischetti and the Technology Department for their support with the students taking the State Alternate Assessment on computers for the first time.
	Ms. Eskew stated that she met with the staff to organize the summer special education program and it went very well.
	Ms. Eskew reported that she is working on the job descriptions and job posts for open positions in the district to be filled over the summer.
CPSE/CSE REPORTS	Mrs. Cmar-Grote moved that the Board of Education approve the CPSE and CSE reports dated March 31, 2016.
TECHNOLOGY UPDATE	Mr. Fischetti reported that all major work for the Intralogic installation is completed. New software needs to be installed and punch list items need to be completed. The Smart Bond process is very slow. If we are able to go through the E-rate funding program to purchase the wireless network cabling and switches, it will free up money in the Smart Bond, which would enable us to increase the number of iPads we can purchase. The IPad deployment plan and a summary of the Technology Committee's work will be presented at the May Board meeting. The \$1.2 million Smart School Investment Plan, created by the Technology Committee, needs to be submitted to the Board of approval. Mr. Fischetti commented that, to date, not one district has seen any money from it yet.

	WHEREAS, the public school districts and the BOCES have agreed to form a Cooperative (the "Cooperative") for this purpose;
	WHEREAS, the North Bellmore School District is desirous of participating in the Cooperative for joint solicitation of proposals for pupil transportation services as authorized by General Municipal Law, Section 119-0 in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Inter-Municipal Cooperative Transportation Agreement attached hereto;
	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education authorizes the School District to participate in the Cooperative; and
	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby approves the Inter-Municipal Cooperative Transportation Agreement (Recitals) attached hereto and authorizes the Board President to execute the Agreement on behalf of the Board of Education. Mrs. Cmar-Grote seconded and the motion was carried 4-0.
